About the speakers

Paul Menzies is the author of many local history books, has worked with the BBC and Granada Television, and created an exhibition at the Dorman Museum. He writes for the Middlesbrough Evening Gazette and contributes to many BBC Tees programmes.

Martin Peagam is a local historian and a proud Stocktonian who never fails to mention that Stockton is the true birthplace of both the railways and the safety match. He provides talks and tours covering diverse topics. He is Secretary of the CTLHS, Chairman of the Captain Cook Birthplace Trust, and a member of various local history and heritage organisations.

Ben Roberts is Roberts is a historian and part-time lecturer. He recently co-led the National Lottery Heritage Fund project “Rememorial WWI” and his forthcoming book *Civic Ritual, Commemoration and Public Celebration in Urban Britain, 1850-1950* will be published by Bloomsbury.

John Little is a Stocktonian but now lives in Cambridge. He is Chair of Trustees at Cambridge Museum of Technology where he recently led a redevelopment project. He still has strong links to Teesside and has published papers in Cleveland History and is currently transcribing and editing the Stockton Book of Orders and Accompts 1620-1835 for the Surtees Society.

Christopher Massey is a Lecturer in Politics and History at Teesside University. His research focuses on the Labour Party and the labour movement. His recent work includes the official biography of Lord Tom Sawyer, *The Man at the Back*, and a forthcoming monograph entitled *The Modernisation of the Labour Party, 1979-97*. He was elected as a Councillor for Redcar and Cleveland Borough Council in 2011, and was Deputy Leader between 2016 and 2019.

Joan Heggie is a Research Fellow in History at Teesside University. Her research focuses on Teesside's industrial past and her oral histories with former steelworkers are exhibited in ‘Steel Stories’ at Kirkleatham Museum (2019-20). Other interests include women's history and the life and art of Viva Talbot (1900-83). Publications include: *Middlesbrough's Iron & Steel Industry* (Amberley, 2013).

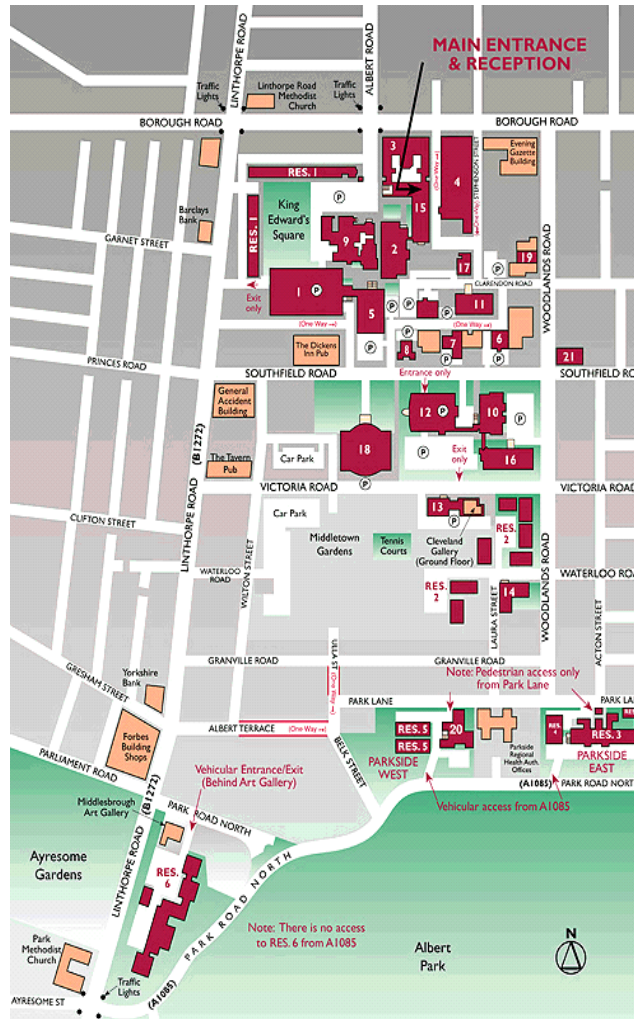

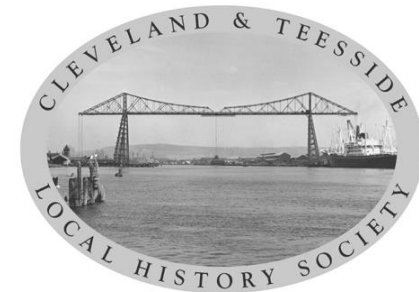
